ORDINANCE NO. 99-268

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR AND ADOPTING FOR THE CITY OF CLINTON, ARKANSAS, FOR THE TWELVE (12) MONTH BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 1999, AND ENDING DECEMBER 31, 1999: APPROPRIATING MONEY FOR EACH AND EVERY ITEM OF EXPENDITURE THEREIN PROVIDED FOR; DECLARING AN EMERGENCY TO EXIST; AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.

WHEREAS, the City Council has made a comprehensive study and review of the proposed budget, and

WHEREAS, it is the opinion of the City Council that the schedules and exhibits of financial information prepared and reviewed and revealing anticipated revenues and expenditures for the calendar year appear to be as accurate as possible for budgetary purposes,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF CLINTON, ARKANSAS:

SECTION 1. This ordinance shall be known as the budget ordinance for the City of Clinton, Arkansas, for the twelve months beginning January 1, 1999, and ending December 31, 1999, reflecting estimated revenues and expenditures as hereinafter set forth on the succeeding pages. All revenues herein are estimated upon available revenues.

SECTION 2. The respective amounts of funds for each and every item of expenditure classification herein proposed in the budget for 1999 are hereby approved by the City of Clinton, Arkansas, and are hereby authorized and appropriated for the purposes herein set forth for the calendar year ending December 31, 1999.

SECTION 3 (a). The Mayor or his duly authorized representative may approve for payment out of funds hereby appropriated for that purpose, or disapprove any bills, debts or liabilities asserted as claims against the City.

SECTION 3 (b). A maximum amount of $\frac{2,000.00}{2,000.00}$ is hereby established, and the payment of disapproval of any bills, debts, or liabilities exceeding that amount shall require the confirmation of the governing body.

SECTION 4. Whereas, it is necessary for the efficient operation of the Municipal Government that a budget be planned and adopted; now therefore an emergency is hereby declared to exist and this ordinance being necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety, shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and approval.
