## ORDINANCE NO. 22

AN ORDINANCE TO PROHIBIT DANCING IN PUBLIC PLACES WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE INCORPORATED CITY OF CLINTON, ARKANSAS.

Be it enacted by the City Council of the incorporated City of Clinton, Arkansas.

SECTION 1. That any owner, operator, agent or employee of any public business, mercantile business, pool hall, billiards parlor, restaurant, cafe, market, hotel, or any shed, platform, hall or any other place erected and or designed for a place to dance, or any other public place within the corporate limits of the incorporated City of Clinton, Arkansas, who shall permit anyone or any group of people to dance in said place of business or public place as above set out and defined, shall be guilty of violating this ordinance and punished for such violation.

SECTION 2. That anyone who shall be convicted of violating this ordinance shall be punished by a fine of not less than \$5.00 and not more than \$50.00 together with all cost incident to such fine.

SECTION 3. That all ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed and this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after proper publication.
