ORDINANCE NO. 34

AN ORDINANCE TAXING MUSIC MACHINES WITHIN THE INCORPORATED LIMITS OF CLINTON. ARKANSAS.

Be it ordained by the City Council of the Incorporated City of Clinton, Arkansas, that City Ordinance No. 28 be amended to read as follows:

SECTION 1. The operation of a public music machine for the entertainment of the public or to draw attention, patronage or trade is hereby declared to be a privilege and anyone operating such a machine or instrument within the corporate limits of the City of Clinton, Arkansas are hereby taxed an annual tax of \$5.00 which may be paid \$2.50 each half calendar year.

SECTION 2. Anyone operating a public music machine, or instrument, within the corporate limits of Clinton, Arkansas without first having procured a permit to do so from the City Council and paying the tax as above provided and set out shall be fined in any sum not less than \$5.00 and not more than \$100.00 and each day or part of a day that same is operated shall constitute a separate offense.

SECTION 3. Anyone being convicted of violating the above ordinance more than two times shall forfeit to the city the machine which was operated in violation of this ordinance and the city authorities shall have the right to confiscate same and sell it at their discretion.
